*O*n December 31, 1935, Jerry and Georgia Baldwin of Richard, Texas welcomed their sixth child of seven into the family...Lois Jean. She accepted Christ at an early age in the Methodist Church and attended elementary and middle school in Richard. She later moved to Houston, Texas, and attended Jack Yates High School where she met Ira D. Thomas. This union produced two beautiful daughters, Jacqueline, and Shelia.

On April 1, 1987, she married Jessie Rison, and they were blessed with two boys: Edward and Renault. Lois was baptized by Rev. Booker and continued her faith journey at the River Brook Missionary Baptist Church under the leadership of Rev O.L. Hughes.

Affectionately known as Momma, Grandma, Aunt Jean, and Ms. Jean, her life can be compared to a beautiful bouquet comprised of flowers of love, care, concern, compassion, and sharing. She did not have to know you to help you or share with you. Her doors were always open and giving to those in need was never an issue. However, it must be made clear...she did not hesitate to get you straight if you got out of line!

Vocationally, Lois worked at M.D. Anderson Cancer Center Hospital for 22 years. She retired on August 31, 1996. Still wanting to give and serve, she then worked in the private home sector for 15 years.
